Funding Snapshot

- All-male founded companies in Europe have closed more than €10 billion each year since 2015, while female-founded companies broke that threshold for the first time in 2021 and all female founded companies have exceeded €1 billion only once, in 2021. (Pitchbook European All In Report 2024)¹
- In 2022 in Europe, women-founded startups account for only 10% of startups created, 7% of fundraising carried out and receive only 2% of funds raised. (BCG Sista Barometer Europe 2023)²
- Women raised 3 times more in gender-mixed teams than in women-only teams in 2022. Women-only teams raise 4 times less than men-only teams. (BCG Sista Barometer Europe 2023)³
- France ranks 6th globally by VC investment in 2024 so far, and 3rd in Europe. (Dealroom France Tech Update Q2 2024 VC report)³
- France registered €1.7 billion in deal value over 276 deals in 2023. (Pitchbook European All In Report 2024)⁵
- US investors have increased their participation in French deals, representing nearly half of total value in Q2 2024 at €1.1 billion and 21% of deal volume. (Pitchbook France Private Capital Breakdown 2024)⁴
- In France, women-founded startups account for only 7% of creation, 7% of fundraisings and 2% of funds raised. Even in industries where most women found startups, women raise 3 times less than men. (BCG Sista Barometer France 2023)⁵
- Paris is the #2 tech hub in Europe by VC investment with \$3.2 billion raised in H1 2024 (behind London \$6.9 billion), 72% of all French Venture Capital. (Dealroom France Q2 2024 VC report)⁸
- According to the WE Cities 2023 Report (Dell Technologies / S&P 2023)⁶ Paris is ranked 4th best city in the world overall for women entrepreneurs and 7th when it comes to access to capital.

2022 was a very difficult year for venture capital worldwide. Thankfully, France has seen a recovery in dealmaking tracking on par with 2023, with early-stage French VC being relatively stable and late-stage investment making a come-back. (Dealroom France Tech Update Q2 2024 VC report)¹⁰

The French government has emphasized “digital sovereignty” and aims to encourage the development of a domestic AI industry. Of the top 10 deals in Q2 2024 in France, 4 were AI related (largest being Mistral AI) with enterprise software is still the largest sector receiving funding ahead of energy and transportation. (Pitchbook France Private Capital Breakdown 2024)¹¹

“Despite the steady growth of the European VC market, we are still lagging behind other global players. This gap is particularly visible for late-stage financing, especially in clean tech, quantum computing and AI. To meet our investment needs, we need to channel more money into the EU capital market. We need bigger funds with more firepower, and we need to attract more investors into venture capital.” Kerstin Jorna, Director General at the European Commission. (European Women in VC Report 2024)¹²

Overall France is doing well, ranked 6th globally in terms of VC investment and 3rd in Europe. As for Paris, it is the #2 tech hub in Europe by VC investment, receiving 72% of all French capital. Despite its ranking as 4th best city in the world for women entrepreneurs (WE Cities report by Dell and S&P 2023¹³), Paris ranked 7th out of 55 on the capital score, relating to access to funding for women entrepreneurs. While there is a wealth of resources available for entrepreneurs in Paris and France, particularly when it comes to VC funding, the fact remains that there are fewer angel networks and very few resources dedicated to funding women entrepreneurs, who only received 2% of funds raised in France in 2023. Let’s take a deeper look into the breadth of different funding and other types of resources available to women entrepreneurs and opportunities to move the needle forward.

General Sources of Funding in Paris and the Rest of France

There are many diverse sources of funding for startups and scale ups in Paris and France including VC and private equity funds, angel networks, funding platforms, accelerators and strong government programs supported by the French government and diverse grant-making bodies. Despite a common tendency for entrepreneurs to focus on angels and venture capital funds, women entrepreneurs are encouraged to explore both non-dilutive (where you retain equity, such as grants, debt) and dilutive (equity) options to fund and scale their businesses. [Viva Tech](#), and BPI France’s annual [BiG event](#) are great place to meet many leading French and global corporates and investors all in one go. We invite you to be inspired by the success stories of French women founders Rachel Delacour, Céline Lazorthes, Lucie Basch, Alix de Sagazan and Marion Carrette, who have all raised significant funding, many of whom have gone on to start new businesses and become investors themselves.

France has a very rich venture capital landscape. French government investment body [BPI France](#) is the top VC investor in France with over 776 investments from (2020-2024) and €17.32 billion in direct funding to date. Iconic VC firm [Kima Ventures](#) founded by France's most well-known serial entrepreneur Xavier Niel, comes in second behind BPI France in terms of investments made. (Pitchbook France Market Snapshot 2024)¹⁴ Other leading funds include [Partech Ventures](#) investing in technology for 40 years, [360 Partners](#) financing innovation for 25 years, [Alven Capital Partners](#) has backed over 130

companies including BIME analytics led by Rachel Delacour and sold to Zendesk, [Serena Capital](#) and [EQT Ventures](#). There are many VC funds to fit all stages of funding, many in the early stage bracket including [Newfund Capital](#) who invest in early stage French companies with global ambition, [Side Capital](#), and [Daphni](#) who offer an innovative VC-as-a-platform format of funding, experts and a digital platform to engage founders and share deal flow. [Founders Future](#) invest in digital and tech companies at seed stage.

Notable funds with women partners include, [Ventech](#), Deeptech fund [Elaia](#), Edtech/Future of Work fund [Educapital](#), [2050](#), [Korelya](#) (founded by a former French Minister for Innovation and Digital Economy), and newer fund [Emblem](#). [Eurazeo](#) is undeniably one of French's top Private Equity firms, and now one of France's top VCs. Indeed, Eurazeo recently acquired Idivest, another of France's famous venture capital firms. [France Invest](#) positions itself as the French voice of private equity, infrastructure and private debt and provides debt and equity solutions for all unlisted companies. When it comes to equity crowdfunding, [Crowdcube](#) and [So We Fund](#) with over 135,000 members lead the way.

Paris has seen the birth of some super investor funding platforms. [Super Capital](#) was one of the top investors in France (2020-2024) and offers both debt and equity solutions to entrepreneurs. [AngelSquare](#) has also invested in over 94 deals in over the same period. (Pitchbook France Market Snapshot 2024)¹⁵

Sustainability Focused



The Rise of Impact and Sustainability Focused Investors

President Macron's strategy for France to be a leading country to implement the green transition, investing massively in this sector and recognizing it as a global imperative, has resulted in a rise in VC funds and impact investors focused on sustainability. One such fund leading the charge is [2050](#), founded by one of France's most innovative and respected VCs, Marie Ekeland. 2050 is blazing a trail as France's first evergreen fund that rethinks investment, to craft a fertile world.

"The sustainable transformation of the economy is driving more women to entrepreneurship, creating necessary transdisciplinary and diversity bridges and giving birth to more mission-driven, inclusive and transformative companies. At 2050, 100% of our portfolio companies are shaping a fertile future and 42% are female-led." Marie Ekeland, Founder & CEO, 2050

Another trailblazer, Clara Gaymard paved the way with [RAISE](#), an investment and innovation mission driven company with a unique business model, where their investment teams donate 50% of their carried interest to their philanthropic RAISE Sherpas endowment fund. [LiTA](#) invests in social enterprises with a strong sustainable development and positive impact and [Inco Ventures](#) invest in the most promising startups and companies shaping the new inclusive and sustainable economy. [Change Now](#) the world expo of solutions for the planet held in Paris annually and co-founded by Rose May Lucotte, is a great place to meet many investors and potential partners focused on shaping a sustainable world. Stéphane Bourbier, Founding Partner at [Asterion Ventures](#) shares:

"We recently conducted a study on Greentech founders in France, and the results were striking: only 22% of founding teams have at least one woman. At Asterion, we're ahead with 40% female representation, but there's still significant progress to be made. Research consistently demonstrates that more diverse teams are not only smarter but also perform better. This isn't about ideology—it's about sound business strategy. So, what needs to change? First, we must get investors to prioritize diversity. Second, we need to inspire more women to become founders, with role models playing a critical part in that journey."

Regarding angel networks, [France Angels](#), is a federation of all the angel networks in France with over 5,500 angels in 64 networks. Also check out the [Side Angels](#) deal platform to invest in French startups alongside experienced business angels.

Non Dilutive

When it comes to non-dilutive options, once again BPI France leads the way with among many offerings, an [Innovation Grant](#), [French Tech Scholarship](#) as well as an [International Growth Loan](#) for companies

scaling to other countries. Team France Export from the CCI Paris (Paris Chamber of Commerce and Industry) also offers the [Export Relaunch Cheque](#) to help SMEs and ETIs conquer new markets.

Regional grants and support worth exploring include the Hauts de France Region – [Start'Up](#) grant and Ile de France Region – [Innov'Up grant](#) for innovation projects. If you have consistent revenues, revenue based finance could be a good non-dilutive option. Check out [We Do Good](#), [Erable](#) and [Unlimitd](#). [Bankr club](#) matches founders with financial experts and bankers, which can be particularly helpful to women founders who often self-opt-out from seeking bank loans. [Kiss Kiss Bank Bank](#) is a leading crowdfunding platform to check out, with options for pre-order campaigns, subscription campaigns and testing new products.

Top Sources of Funding for Women Entrepreneurs

Even though Paris is a leading country for investment and venture capital, progress still needs to be made when it comes to sources of funding specifically focused on investing in women founders. Comparing the previous list to below shows a striking contrast indeed.



Dilutive

There are only 2 VC funds founded by women and focused on investing in founding teams with at least one women founder as part of their theses in Paris: [WinEquity](#), founded by Florence Richardson and [SISTA fund](#) founded by serial founder turned VC, Tatiana Jama. There are 3 key angel networks that actively invest in women founders: [Femmes Business Angels](#), and newcomers [Leia Capital](#) and [Olympe Capital](#). Leading accelerators supporting women founders both in Paris and across France include [Les Premières](#) and [Willla](#).

Non Dilutive

Women-founder focused debt funding options include the [Initiative France Honour Loan](#) whose guarantee facilitates access to bank credit for women with business with start-up, takeover or development projects and are granted by the Initiative France network without the need for a personal guarantee, the [France Active Garantie Egalité Femme](#) and [Réseau Entreprendre Honour Loan](#). Credit Entreprise offers the [CLEFE debt financing program](#) for women entrepreneurs of all types.

Other Resources for Women Entrepreneurs



Based in Paris, [STATION F](#) is the largest startup campus in the world, with 1000 startups, [30+ accelerator programs](#) run some of the best business schools and large corporates and a full range of services. From the beginning, they have been very supportive of women founders consistently working towards 30% - 40% of their startups having at least one women founder. They also run the [female founders fellowship](#), only accessible to entrepreneurs already in Station F.

"Oddly, female founders tend to secure much less capital than their male counterparts, despite the fact that we have been seeing more and more highly-qualified female founders. We are pleased to say that there are exceptions - but they are still exceptions, and this needs to change." Roxanne Varza, Director of, STATION F

[La French Tech Grand Paris](#) is a key government run body that supports French tech companies in Paris who are key to the country's innovation strategy, offering a wide range of services. [France Digitale](#) also works to promote French talent, providing entrepreneurs with tools, contacts and awareness campaigns for diverse stakeholders. [Viva Tech](#) has a Female Founders Challenge every year you can be part of and [50 in Tech](#) is working to increase diversity in tech and also help companies with DEI (diversity, equity and inclusion). Newcomer, [Thousand Faces](#) has an accelerator program and offers mentoring and the opportunity to pitch to investors. Scaling tech women entrepreneurs who have raised over €1 million should explore [The Gallion Project](#) community.

[50 Partners](#) created by 50 outstanding French entrepreneurs, offer funding as well as tailored support, advice, office space and access to their networks and [French Founders](#) is an international network for French speaking founders, offering many services including access to talent. Paris, one of the world's capitals of luxury, boasts 3 major programs supporting women entrepreneurs. [Cartier Women's Initiative](#) spearheaded from Paris, is a global gold standard entrepreneurship program to drive change by empowering women entrepreneurs. Their regional awards include \$100,000 grants for first place awardees as well as stellar human capital support. [La maison des startups LVMH](#) offers fast-track for startups to navigate the LVMH Group and start new conversations with Maisons on a global scale, and the [Veuve Clicquot Bold](#) program, awards and platform are also great resources.

Other leading accelerator programs in Paris you can explore include the [Plug and Play](#) programs including their FoundHer program, and [Entrepreneur First](#) who provide funding as well as access to potential co-founders. Sustainability and social impact startups should explore the [Techstars Sustainability Accelerator](#), La Ruche accelerator's [Les Audacieuses](#) and [Les Ambitieuses programs](#) and

[Inco Entrepreneurs](#), who offer funding as well as access to skills and networks. Réseau Entreprendre offers the [Wom'energy Programme](#) for women founders, [The Family](#) has pivoted their accelerator program offering, and global programs [Antler](#), [Google for Startups](#) and [Microsoft for Startups Founders Hub](#) all offer European programs that cover France. 100 000 Entrepreneurs does a marvelous job of encouraging more young people to become entrepreneurs and have a [women's entrepreneurship week](#) every year.

When it comes to helping women entrepreneurs export and access markets, [Business France](#) fosters export growth for SMEs and mid-sized companies. [Paris regions](#) has created a very helpful list of accelerators and incubators you can explore. Other important certification bodies that help women entrepreneurs access corporate supply chains in France and other countries include [WeConnect International](#) and newcomer [ESDP](#) who specifically support ethnic minority founders in Europe.

Prominent Communities for Women Entrepreneurs



There is a good selection of women entrepreneur communities in Paris and across France, some associations, others organized and supported by corporates. [Sista Founders program](#) has a comprehensive program to help women entrepreneurs get ready for funding and the community also does a lot of advocacy for women entrepreneurs and access to capital. [FCE Frances \(Femmes Chefs d'Entreprise\)](#), the French branch of a global network, supports women entrepreneurs' professional and personal development and [Femmes des Territoires](#) and [Bouge Ta Boîte](#) both offer networks and resources for different types of women entrepreneurs in Paris and across all regions of France.

Prominent corporate-led programs supporting women entrepreneurs in France include: BNP Paribas [Connect'Her](#)s program, the [Orange Femmes Entrepreneuses](#) program that supports 100 women entrepreneurs every year and the [EY Winning Women EMEA](#) program, that supports scaling women founders (who have €1 million+ in revenue).

Other leading women entrepreneurs and women's networks include: [PWN Paris](#) the first international professional women's network dedicated to gender balance, women's leadership and career development who also have an entrepreneurship club for women founders. [Actionelles](#) and [Empow'Her](#) offer training, networking and events, [Financielles](#) is a federation of networks supporting women in the financial industry and [Ladies Bank](#) encourages more women to manage their wealth. [Forces Femmes](#) helps women over 45 create a business or find a job.

Finally, two prominent events and awards for women entrepreneurs in France are the [Join Forces and Dare](#) mobilizing public, private and media players in Europe, Africa and Canada for over 10 years to reveal new tech leaders and the [Madame Figaro – Business with Attitude](#) award for women entrepreneurs.

Areas for Improvement

Capital is an ongoing challenge for women entrepreneurs in all cities. In France, specifically, a study found that only 10.0% of female entrepreneurs approach banks for support, which is about one-third fewer than their male counterparts. While the Paris metropolitan area attracts a lot of capital, particularly venture capital, ranking 4th out of the 55 cities, women entrepreneurs are still underrepresented in terms of acquiring capital. Paris ranks 7th in the capital pillar and 19th in terms of proportionate funding, that is, when compared to funding levels of male entrepreneurs in the city who are near the middle of the group. (DWEN WE Cities 2023 Report - Dell Technologies / S&P 2023¹⁶) This is clearly apparent when you compare the number of women-only focused sources of funding the general sources of funding available in the city.

“Despite record levels of venture funding and a strong track record bringing breakthrough innovation to market, the venture asset class remains underfunded. In particular, funds with diverse teams and women leaders offer unparalleled returns and drive positive impact, warranting far greater investment. It is crucial for the largest pools of capital to engage with the venture ecosystem, participating at all levels, from fund of funds to direct investing and across the capital stack. It is time to think in systems to solve some of the world’s most pressing challenges. There has never been a better time to be a venture investor.” Kinga Stanislawska, Co-founder, European Women in VC.

Encouraging signs of things starting to move forward are events such as [WVCE](#) that brings together European women in VC/women fund managers and [InvestHer Summit](#), connecting women entrepreneurs with investors, corporates, funding ecosystem players and policy shapers, to change the funding game. However, despite its excellent position in the European funding landscape and globally, Paris is still far from ‘égalité and fraternité’ when it comes to equal funding for women entrepreneurs. There is a need for more VC funds of considerable size founded by and focused on funding women, as well as more women angel networks. France also has an opportunity to leverage its excellent positioning when it comes to gender equality in the leadership positions of public companies, and very strong support of the French tech and funding ecosystem. The country could potentially explore tax incentives for funds and private investors who invest in more women entrepreneurs, as well as reallocating part of existing public funds in BPI France towards women focused VC funds. Without adequate capital, it is hard for French women entrepreneurs to reach their fullest potential as equal economic contributors to the country’s GDP. The city of lights can also potentially move up the ranks globally, by investing more strategically in its women entrepreneurs. By actively funding more women entrepreneurs in particular in AI, Enterprise SaaS and Sustainability as part of the key focus areas of its national economic strategy, France could really show the way. Vive la France. Vive les Femmes Entrepreneurs! (let’s celebrate France, and women entrepreneurs!).





